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Project Jupiter as a data center would be environmentally destructive to a severe degree that it would end up affecting not only the water resources in the US, but also global climate. Quite frankly, the planet already has enough climate issues as it is, so when it comes to large water-consuming data centers like this, it is a matter of global concern. Heatwaves in Europe have already reached 40C while tropical countries are slowly sinking. Though these things are the result of many contributing factors, it is undeniable that AI centers play a huge role in global warming and we must do what we can to, at the very least, mitigate the effects and build a more sustainable planet earth under the United Nations' Sustainable Development Goals.

"The public should be given an additional 60 days to review and comment on the air quality permit so community members can participate equitably.
