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I can see the approval of this permit becoming a hazard for the many people and wildlife that live in Dona Ana County. What is happening with this data center is so useless and there are much bigger things to focus on. With the amount of money and water being used the data center would be the same as a neighborhood. Although the advancement of AI is going way too fast to contain we don't need these big ass data centers to control it. If there is enough calculations and predictions for how this data center is going to be made and what damages it can cause, there can be enough calculations to find a better, greener solution that will bring benefits to the community of Dona Ana County.

The public should be given an additional 60 days to review and comment on the air quality permit so community members can participate equitably.

The air quality permit application should be denied outright given Bloom Energy's history of illegal dumping hazardous waste. Approving this permit would be government-sponsored environmental racism directed at residents of Doña Ana County.

If the permit is not denied outright, a public hearing needs to be held in Santa Teresa, in both English and Spanish, with an option to participate virtually.
