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This new data center will devastate the climate of our current earth. Tons upon tons of carbon are going to be released into our already damaged atmosphere. The data center will only push us forward in the destruction of our home. It is not, even by a fraction, worth it. The first thing I would like to say is that the data center will harm the people of Doña Ana County. The county has a population of 229,091 - the amount of people that will be affected both communally and individually by the establishment of projected Jupiter. Data centers have shocking side effects on those who live nearby them. These effects can include the discharge of cancer causing chemicals, such as benzene. The data center can also lead to heavy metal waste, these include lead, arsenic, and chromium. In addition to these already deadly chemicals, the discharge of other toxic compounds such as sulfur are highly likely. All of these chemicals produced have a guaranteed chance of poisoning the population and communities of Doña Ana County and can cause blood cancer, blindness, birth defects, and various types of lung disease. This data center clearly has a high chance of causing detrimental effects on the community of Doña Ana County. The environmental impacts will also be devastating, with over 2GW of energy being produced under this new data center. The carbon footprint of such a massive project will produce roughly 10 million tons of carbon dioxide annually, this far exceeds environmental capacity. This project should take into consideration the following: The approval of Blooms air quality permit will be deemed a form of government-sponsored environmental racism, as the people of Doña Ana County are already unfairly affected by environmental pollution as well as the air quality not meeting federal standards. The air quality permit must be denied, given Blooms' unclean legal history. In an outcome where the permit is approved, a hearing must be held in Santa Teresa - open to the public.
