I am writing to ask the New Mexico Environment Department's Air Quality Bureau to deny Yucca Growth Infrastructure's air quality permit application.

Project Jupiter is not just one isolated development. It is part of a larger wave of data center projects being proposed across New Mexico. Approving this permit could set a dangerous precedent and make it increasingly difficult for communities to challenge similar projects in the future.

They say it is easier to give something than to take it away. Once permits are granted, facilities are built, and pollution becomes part of our daily lives, reversing those decisions becomes extremely difficult. That is why the Air Quality Bureau must act before the damage is done.

Our communities should not be forced to bear increased air pollution and environmental risks so private companies can increase their profits. I am deeply concerned that approving this permit will encourage even more large-scale data center developments across New Mexico, placing additional burdens on our air, water, energy resources, and communities. At some point, state agencies must say that enough is enough.

Please do not continue sacrificing our communities for private profit. Listen to the people who live here and who will have to live with the long-term consequences of these decisions.
