My name is Jasmin. Although I am not a New Mexico resident, I am writing because I am concerned about the risks and harms Project Jupiter poses to New Mexicans. I am submitting this comment to urge the New Mexico Environment Department to reject Yucca Growth Infrastructure, LLC's air permit application for the YGI Microgrid in Doña Ana County. Climate change has already impacted all of us and we only have 3 years left to fix it. Building these centers would greatly impact global warming and not only harm new mexico but other countries as well. You can see the impact global warming has on Europe. Streets are destroyed because of the heat. Parts of the Eifel tower melted because of the heat and it's not even peak summer yet.
