Project Jupiter initially applied for air permits to the New Mexico Environment Department (NMED) back in April, under the first name Acoma LLC. This original application sought to build two, separate gas power plants. After the public successfully submitted over 7,000 comments that were overwhelmingly in opposition to the gas plants, the developers have decided to completely scrap those applications and re-start the process proposing a new kind of fuel cell technology.

The public should be given an additional 60 days to review and comment on the air quality permit so community members can participate equitably.

The air quality permit application should be denied outright given Bloom Energy's history of illegal dumping hazardous waste. Approving this permit would be government-sponsored environmental racism directed at residents of Doña Ana County.

If the permit is not denied outright, a public hearing needs to be held in Santa Teresa, in both English and Spanish, with an option to participate virtually.
