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I hope that NMED will NOT grant this bad actor an air quality permit. It is well known that this data center, if activated, will not only use water that our state simply does not have, but will also emit more greenhouse gasses than the two largest cities in our state. Doing anything that would allow this bad actor, to be clear the bad actor is the data center, to harm our communities, waters, air, land and future, all for a measly 1500 jobs is a crime. And no, construction jobs are not long term. And you know what is longterm: the MEGADROUGHT and the painful impacts our communities and ecosystems are currently facing. It's time for NMED to do their part and be responsible as people who care about this state and its people, air and water. Selling us out for bad actors like Project Jupiter, other data centers, and the myriad of other extractive industries that are already harming our state and people will not go unnoticed. Nothing will ever be enough for extractive industries so it's up to us to tell them no and send them packing.
