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The El Paso/ciudad Juárez corridor is already a problematic area for air quality. Asarco, the cleanest copper mill in the country at the time, regularly had to halt operations when the wind came from the south. The amount of smog that the lax regulations in Mexico produce is already out of hand, it makes no sense for a data center to be put in the area. The natural gas cells required for a data center would only exacerbate the problem. Additionally the other pollutants are completely unacceptable and pave the way for a disaster cleanup in our children's future like the before mentioned Asarco site in EP. Not to mention the effects that the site will have on current residents. This company already has a track record of disregarding the public safety. It would be gross negligence, if not malicious intent if NMED approves this.
