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As a resident of New Mexico, I strongly oppose Project Jupiter and urge decision-makers to reject it.

The jobs this project promises are temporary, but its consequences for our communities, water resources, wildlife, and landscape could last for generations. Too often, public hearings give the appearance that citizens have a voice, yet many residents feel the outcome has already been decided before a single comment is made. If public input is truly valued, then it should have the power to influence the final decision.

New Mexico deserves a long-term vision, not another project that consumes enormous amounts of land and water while offering only short-lived economic benefits. Instead of covering our state with massive industrial developments and data centers, we should be investing in reliable, high-output energy infrastructure. Advanced nuclear fission has the potential to provide dependable power, strengthen New Mexico's energy independence, and support sustainable economic growth without the sprawling land footprint required by many large-scale renewable installations.

Project Jupiter represents a short-sighted approach to development. It prioritizes corporate interests over the long-term well-being of New Mexico's people, natural resources, and future. The profits will largely leave with the companies involved, while local communities are left to manage the environmental and infrastructure impacts for decades.

New Mexico deserves investment that builds lasting prosperity—not projects that deliver temporary gains while imposing permanent costs. I respectfully urge you to reject Project Jupiter and pursue policies that protect our water, preserve our environment, and secure a stronger, more self-reliant future for our state.
