My name is Thomas A. Georges, and I am the Manager and Vice President of Jobeco Materials, LLC, the General Partner of Jobe Materials, L.P. I appreciate the opportunity to share comments regarding Project Jupiter's air quality permit applications.

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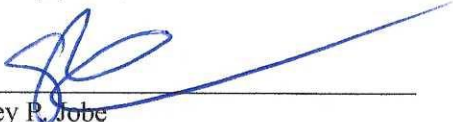
