Dear NMED staff, My name is Victoria. I am a not resident of New Mexico but I am still writing to you because I am concerned about the risks and harms Project Jupiter poses to New Mexicans or the world in general. I am submitting this comment to urge the New Mexico Environment Department to reject Yucca Growth Infrastructure, LLC's air permit application for the YGI Microgrid in Doña Ana County. I am someone who has eczema. Heat waves/ climate change affects me a lot, because my eczema breaks out and sometimes can be so bad I can't even walk. The project's proposed fuel cell powered grid is concerning for many reasons: It would still produce a high level of greenhouse gas and toxic pollutants This technology generates toxic waste, and the process for handling this waste is still unclear. Fuel cell technology or a centralized waste system has never occurred at this scale. Surrounding communities' air will be negatively impacted by this development. I urge the NMED to outright reject YUCCA Yucca Growth Infrastructure, LLC's air permit application for the YGI Microgrid.
