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I live in northern Georgia. There is already a data center that is being built about an hour from me. Hopefully this trend will not continue, but if it does, there will likely be a data center in every state in 50 years max. If the building of these data centers continues, there will be no water to drink, to shower, or to fulfill basic human necessities. According to the Office of the State Engineer, this data centers will require 1,000,000 gallons of water per day. Along with other data centers that are being built across the country who need similar amounts, the amount to go around for citizens decreases greatly. There will be no fresh air for people to breathe. It will all be replaced by carbon dioxide emissions. This type of plant, a fuel cell plant, has never been built before at this size.
