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Reject the permit for Yucca Growth. While there are many reasons to oppose Project Jupiter, the extreme environmental damage projected by the project provides adequate cause for New Mexico Environment Department to reject the Yucca Growth Infrastructure, LLC-YGI Microgrid Air Quality Construction Permit.

Although Yucca Growth has reduced the proposed emissions from the project by proposing to use fuel cells, this change does not adequately mitigate the climate destroying emissions from their plant. The projected emissions still exceed the combined emissions from New Mexico's largest cities. Yucca Growth estimated their emissions based on the output of ONE FUEL CELL, while the project will employ over 2000 fuel cells, each with a separate stack. The efficiency of the fuel cells will vary over time and there is no way to monitor the total output of the plant or force compliance with their original emissions projections.

The New Mexico Environmental Department now has the power to be the grownup in the room and send Yucca Growth Infrastructure back to the drawing board. Tell them to come back when they have a plan that is environmentally neutral and doesn't destroy the environment in the surrounding communities.
