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The air quality permit application for the Project Jupiter Data Center projects that air emissions will exceed the combined emissions of Albuquerque and Las Cruces. Project Jupiter is being built in Santa Teresa, NM, on the edge of the Sunland Park non attainment zone where ozone levels created by volatile organic gasses and other pollutants violate EPA standards. Residents of Santa Teresa (6 miles from the center of Sunland Park) and Sunland Park are mostly of Mexican or Hispanic heritage and with a lower than average US median income. These populations deserve and are legally entitled to the protection of the state of New Mexico and, specifically, by its Air Quality Bureau, in regard to their health and quality of life. There is no study of the possible cumulative health effects of this project plus existing polluting projects in the area.

Please keep our state of New Mexico as clean as possible including our air quality which improves New Mexicans lives and deny the application for an air quality permit for Project Jupiter.
