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We do not need nor want this data center. With the current state of our earth: rising temperatures, pollution, poor air and water quality, and struggling communities, this data center will only be deleterious in many more ways that WILL set us back further and lessen our chance to fix what we have mistakenly destroyed. Choosing to continue Project Jupiter would be a willing choice to put the world in an early grave.

The public should be given an additional 60 days to review and comment on the air quality permit so community members can participate equitably.

The air quality permit application should be denied outright given Bloom Energy's history of illegal dumping hazardous waste. Approving this permit would be government-sponsored environmental racism directed at residents of Doña Ana County.

If the permit is not denied outright, a public hearing needs to be held in Santa Teresa, in both English and Spanish, with an option to participate virtually.
