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I urge NMED to completely reject YUCCA yucca growth infrastructure, LLC's air permit application for the YGI Microgrid. I also ask the department to please hold a bilingual public hearing near the Santa Teresa community, so residents can learn about risks associated with the fuel cell technology. Although I am not a resident of New Mexico, I have family and friends who live there. I want what is better for not only their lives but also everyone else's lives and the wild life that resides there. This project would still produce high levels of green house gas and toxic pollutants which are very well known to have negative impacts on the environment. This technology generates toxic waste, and the process for handling that waste remains unclear. Project Jupiter's power plant will release up to 10 million tons of climate-warming greenhouse gases annually. If NMED's mission really is 'to protect and restore the environment and to foster a healthy and prosperous New Mexico for present and future generations.'
