My name is Denicia Cadena. I am a generational New Mexican who was born and raised in the Mesilla Valley and now living in Albuquerque's South Valley. I am asking the New Mexico Environment Department (NMED) to reject Yucca Growth Infrastructure, LLC's air quality permits.

In Albuquerque our precious river bed and surrounding Bosque are completely dry. Our New Mexico decision makers and the New Mexico Environment Department need to be focused on how we can mitigate the harms of climate change. Project Jupiter is being framed as economic development. Our families and communities can't afford to resource a data center that would drain environmental resources that are dwindling at unprecedented rates.
