I am asking that you deny Yucca Growth Infrastructure's air quality permit due to the predicted health impacts of air pollution and hazardous waste.

My asks:

- The public should be given an additional 60 days to review and comment on the air quality permit so community members can participate equitably.
- The air quality permit application should be denied given Bloom Energy's history of illegal dumping hazardous waste.
- If the permit is not denied, a public hearing needs to be held in Santa Teresa, in both English and Spanish, with an option to participate virtually.
- Approving this permit would be government-sponsored environmental racism as residents of Doña Ana County are already disproportionately impacted by environmental pollution.
- For years, Doña Ana County has been called a 'nonattainment' zone— this means our air quality does not meet federal government rules.
