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The creation of a data center in New Mexico is fundamentally both ignorant and completely disregarding human life. Building a data center in an area that is already struggling with the resources of the land and at such a scale can only be seen as nothing more than an intentional plot to starve out and remove the "unlucky". There are no statements that put this data center into good light, it is an impossibly sick building plan no matter how much you speak of "Innovation". Life without Ai was perfectly fine, there is zero reason to continue consuming our finite resources on this earth because you feel the need to line pockets of the rich for a project that failed at launch. The obvious adverse effects this would have on the already poor air quality are impossible to just look away from, this is an issue that will continue to plague us long after we die and the next generation will have to breathe in the poisoned air and deal with horrible conditions all in the name of "innovation".

The public should be given an additional 60 days to review and comment on the air quality permit so community members can participate equitably.

If the permit is not denied outright, a public hearing needs to be held in Santa Teresa, in both English and Spanish, with an option to participate virtually.
