Our metro area is currently 16th worst in the nation for ozone pollution and we have received a failing grade on this air quality standard every single year since 2000. We are already breathing some of the most compromised air in the country. It is unacceptable to invite a new source of hyperscale air pollution into our communities.

Hello This data center will only accentuate the already pressing climate crisis, if we take the time to find better sources of energy and better ways to store data instead of continually consuming all the land and resources we have left on earth we will be able to not only further our goals a humanity as a whole but also become more efficient eventually making these massive data centers obsolete. I believe the public should be given an additional 60 days to review and comment on the air quality permit and the air quality permit application should be denied given Bloom Energy's history of illegal dumping hazardous waste in addition to the option of a public hearing needs to be held in Santa Teresa, in both English and Spanish, with an option to participate virtually if the permit is not denied and it can be shown Approving this permit would be government-sponsored environmental racism as residents of Doña Ana County are already disproportionately impacted by environmental pollution.
