Dear NMED staff, While I would like to stay anonymous, I am a New Mexico resident, and I am writing because I am concerned about the risks and harms Project Jupiter poses to not only New Mexicans, but the world at large. I am submitting this comment to urge the New Mexico Environment Department to reject Yucca Growth Infrastructure, LLC's air permit application for the YGI Microgrid in Doña Ana County. These heatwaves are detrimental to everyone across the globe, and building a massive A.I Data Center is going to release 10 million more tons of carbon into the atmosphere, polluting the earth at a faster rate, and speeding up global warming. The proposed fuel cell powered grid produces a high level of greenhouse gas and toxic pollutants, including: cancer causing chemicals (benzene), heavy metals (lead, arsenic, chromium), and toxic compounds (sulfur and others).
