Dear NMED staff, My name is anonymous. I am a New Mexico resident, living in Jemez , and I am writing because I am concerned about the risks and harms Project Jupiter poses to New Mexicans. I am submitting this comment to urge the New Mexico Environment Department to reject Yucca Growth Infrastructure, LLC's air permit application for the YGI Microgrid in Doña Ana County. Why I am concerned about this project is because I am from one of the many Native communities among New Mexico, my people and mostly all of the other Native communities use water to plant, farm, drink , and to do traditional ceremonies with the water. I know that data centers take millions if not billions of water that's surrounding them. We already don't have enough water to supply to the data centers, since we are living in a desert. Also to mention the stuff that will be going into the air, that is literally not okay and you all should know that but your all to busy being selfish of your selfs knowing it won't affect you all since you only care about the profit and money, not the people who have been here far longer than you all have, and I'm talking about the natives since we have been here far longer, we've all fought many times to keep our land, water, and people. Now you all are trying to take away all we've have fought for, it honestly isn't fair since we have been here far more than you have all been. It also is so crazy to me that this 165 billion dollar data base shouldn't even exist in the first place.
