Dear NMED staff, I am writing because I am concerned about the risks and harms Project Jupiter poses to New Mexicans. I am submitting this comment to urge the New Mexico Environment Department to reject Yucca Growth Infrastructure, LLC's air permit application for the YGI Microgrid in Doña Ana County. This mega A.I. data centre would only cause harm to the environment and the residents of New Mexico. There is not enough water for this mega centre and the harm it would breed long term is too great to rationalize anything of this size. People are using less and less A.I. and this blight on the land will only serve to further hurt our people and then the economy. You can never truly "get back" land once something like this is constructed on it. Do not allow this project to materialize. For your people, your land, and for your own family. The project's proposed fuel cell powered grid is concerning for many reasons: It would still produce a high level of greenhouse gas and toxic pollutants. This technology generates toxic waste, and the process for handling this waste is still unclear. Fuel cell technology or a centralized waste system has never occurred at this scale. Surrounding communities' air will be negatively impacted by this development. I urge the NMED to outright reject YUCCA Yucca Growth Infrastructure, LLC's air permit application for the YGI Microgrid.
