Dear NMED staff, I am writing because I am concerned about the risks and harms Project Jupiter poses to New Mexicans. I am submitting this comment to urge the New Mexico Environment Department to reject Yucca Growth Infrastructure, LLC's air permit application for the YGI Microgrid in Doña Ana County. Though I myself am not a local resident, I have loved ones in the affected area and I worry for their wellbeing and safety. The project's proposed fuel cell powered grid is concerning for many reasons: - It would still produce a high level of greenhouse gas and toxic pollutants - This technology generates toxic waste, and the process for handling this waste is still unclear. - Fuel cell technology or a centralized waste system has never occurred at this scale. - Surrounding communities' air will be negatively impacted by this development. I urge the NMED to outright reject YUCCA Yucca Growth Infrastructure, LLC's air permit application for the YGI Microgrid. I ask the department to please hold a bilingual public hearing near the Santa Teresa community, so that residents can learn about the risks associated with fuel cell technology.
