The following are three simple requests that the NMED should consider: 1. The public should be given an additional 60 days to review and comment on the air quality permit so community members can participate equitably. 2. The air quality permit application should be denied given Bloom Energy's history of illegal dumping hazardous waste. 3. If the permit is not denied, a public hearing needs to be held in Santa Teresa, in both English and Spanish, with an option to participate virtually.

Additionally, approving this permit would be government-sponsored environmental racism as residents of Doña Ana County are already disproportionately impacted by environmental pollution. Denying these three requests would be admission that your department's interests lie in places other than protecting the environment, and the guilt for the consequences of your actions (or inaction) will forever be carried on your shoulders.
