Dear NMED staff,

My name is Lee Wilson. I live in Santa Fe, and I am writing because I am concerned about the risks and harms Project Jupiter poses to New Mexicans. I am submitting this comment to urge the New Mexico Environment Department to reject Yucca Growth Infrastructure, LLC's air permit application for the YGI Microgrid in Doña Ana County.

I currently volunteer with Santa Fe Conservation Trust where we build and maintain trails for public use. We also rehabilitate trust lands by planting native grasses and trees while removing invasive species. The gigantic fuel cell/data center is in direct opposition to my values and those of us concerned about our limited natural resources and maintenance of clean water and air.

The project's proposed fuel cell powered grid is concerning for many reasons:

- * It would still produce a high level of greenhouse gas and toxic pollutants.
- * This technology generates toxic waste, and the process for handling this waste is still unclear.
- * Fuel cell technology or a centralized waste system has never been tried at this scale.
- * Surrounding communities' air will be severely impacted by this development.

I urge the NMED to reject YUCCA Yucca Growth Infrastructure, LLC's air permit application for the YGI Microgrid. I ask the department to please hold a bilingual public hearing near the Santa Teresa community, so that residents can learn about the risks associated with fuel cell technology.
