I know all too well the history New Mexico has with environmental pollution and how marginalized communities have been disproportionately affected. This has gone on for too long. People in New Mexico have been working for decades to clean up the contamination that has already occurred in this state. Project Jupiter is not for the people, it is for the rich who see New Mexico as a throw away state to continue to over extract and pollute. The people of New Mexico do not want this. - If the permit is not denied, a public hearing needs to be held in Santa Teresa, in both English and Spanish, with an option to participate virtually.

Approving this permit would be government-sponsored environmental racism as residents of Doña Ana County are already disproportionately impacted by environmental pollution. STOP PROJECT JUPITER NOW!"
