Dear NMED staff,

My name is Anj Barclay. I am an Alamogordo, NM resident. I am writing because I am concerned about the risks and harms Project Jupiter poses to New Mexicans, and to the environment. I am submitting this comment to urge the New Mexico Environment Department to reject Yucca Growth Infrastructure, LLC's air permit application for the YGI Microgrid in Doña Ana County.

As a recent New Mexico transplant, I fell in love with the state and its beauty. The landscapes, the wildlife, the people — all of them deserve better than the outcomes of Project Jupiter.

The project's proposed fuel cell powered grid is concerning for many reasons:

It would still produce a high level of greenhouse gas and toxic pollutants.

This technology generates toxic waste, and the process for handling this waste is still unclear.

Fuel cell technology has never occurred at this scale.

Surrounding communities' air will be negatively impacted by this development.

I urge the NMED to outright reject YUCCA Yucca Growth Infrastructure, LLC's air permit application for the YGI Microgrid. I ask the department to please hold a bilingual public hearing near the Santa Teresa community, so that residents can learn about the risks associated with fuel cell technology.
