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I oppose Project Jupiter because projects of this scale should not move forward without clear transparency, public accountability, and meaningful oversight. When major decisions are made behind closed doors or without adequate public input, they can erode trust and create unintended consequences that affect communities for years. Innovation is important, but it should never come at the expense of privacy, fairness, safety, or democratic participation. Before expanding or implementing Project Jupiter, those responsible should clearly explain its goals, risks, costs, and long-term impacts, and they should be willing to adjust or stop the project if those concerns cannot be addressed. Progress should benefit people, not require blind trust. Any project with significant social, technological, or economic consequences deserves careful scrutiny rather than automatic approval.
