RESOLUTION 2023-03:

Opposition to Unreasonable and Potentially Illegal Permit Conditions Proposed by the NMED on the WIPP Permit Application

Whereas, the Waste Isolation Pilot Plant (WIPP) has been an incredible success story for New Mexicans and for the nation and;

Whereas, WIPP is the crown jewel of the Department of Energy and a source of pride for many New Mexicans;

Whereas, since its opening in 1999, thousands of containers of Transuranic (TRU) waste have been permanently and safely disposed of 2,150 feet underground, including TRU waste from other locations in New Mexico, such as Sandia (SNL) and Los Alamos (LANL) and;

Whereas, WIPP has been an incredible economic driver for New Mexicans, generating thousands of high paying jobs and bringing global scientific expertise to the area and;

Whereas, WIPP's transportation record is second to none with over 15 million safely loaded miles and is used as a model for safety across the globe and;

Whereas, WIPP has worked diligently on compliance with its state regulatory agency, the New Mexico Environment Department (NMED) since opening and has continued to do so through four successive two term administrations in good faith and;

Whereas, the current administration, by adding a list of impractical, unenforceable, and unrelated (with respect to Resource Conservation and Recovery Act or RCRA) demands on the applicant for renewal, has departed from the practice of working in good faith in the issuance of a hazardous waste permit consistent with the promulgated rules laid out in the regulations and;

Whereas, the WIPP facility is federally operated on property granted through authority in the congressionally-passed and presidentially-executed WIPP Land Withdrawal Act, which pre-empts the state of New Mexico from any action to/or from this Act and;

Whereas, it is impractical and an obstruction to the critical federal program to require the DOE to perform unnecessary, costly, and time-consuming "root cause analyses" of each container whenever NMED requests it and;

Whereas, it is even more of an obstruction to the national interest and this critical environmental cleanup program to allow the NMED require the DOE to effectively shut down shipments to the site whenever NMED requests for it any perceived concerns about human health or environment or when there may be any allegations or any type or degrees of permit noncompliance and;

Whereas, as a facility that serves the entire national weapons complex, it is unreasonable and contrary to the intent of the national defense and environmental cleanup programs to assume that the state of NM can hold the rest of the country hostage to prioritize all of the NM or Los Alamos wastes before any other waste from other out-of-state facilities and;

Whereas, the Carlsbad Department of Development (CDOD) is a private, non-profit agency with a membership consisting of over 100 community leaders and chief executive officers in industry, business and finance, the City of Carlsbad, Eddy County Board of Commissioners, Southeast New Mexico College, and others, all with a mutual goal of promoting the economic and general welfare of the citizens of the City of Carlsbad and Eddy County, and;

Whereas, the CDOD is dedicated to economic development within Carlsbad and Eddy County that enhances our community's quality of life, economic growth and the financial well-being of its citizens, and;

Now, therefore on this day of February 2, 2023, be it resolved that we, the Board of Directors of the CDOD hereby support the approval of a RCRA Permit application without NMED's newly proposed unreasonable permit requirements and furthermore encourage the NMED to drop their proposed additions and urge the Governor of the state of New Mexico to recognize and take into due consideration the high level of support that exists in New Mexico for the Waste Isolation Pilot Plant and its continued good service to our nation.
