I support the cleanup of legacy waste at Los Alamos National Laboratory (and this is critical to continuing mission efficacy and expanding future of LANL as a science/research site as well as a weapons facility). However, structuring the permit in a way that prioritizes or limits shipments from other sites could have unintended consequences. If legacy waste shipments decrease in the future, overall shipments to WIPP could drop significantly. This creates risk for long term operations and job stability. WIPP will exist far beyond the oil and gas industry that is currently one of the prime employers of the Permian Basin. With our national security mission to further improve, increase, and rehabilitate our arsenal well equipped waste storage sites with experience are more important than ever. The permit should support both LANL cleanup and continued shipments from approved sites.
