My sincere thanks to NMED for standing up for the people of New Mexico and holding the DOE and LANL accountable to the legally binding permit to which they agreed.

I am in full support of the NMED Permit Modification.

As part of the WIPP Permit Renewal negotiating team, I know that the prioritization of Legacy Waste, from LANL, is an important and key provision of the permit. Legacy Waste from LANL must be prioritized, especially that waste that is in drums, in tents in a wildfire zone. Other waste dump sites like areas C and G must also be cleaned up. "Cap and Cover" is not acceptable.

It is clear that LANL and the DOE have not kept their agreement with the people of New Mexico as required in the Permit.

BRAVO to Secretary Kenney and the staff at NMED for the clear timelines and substantial penalties in this permit modification. LANL and DOE must not be allowed to continue to shirk their responsibilities as legally required in the current permit. Thanks again to NMED for not allowing DOE/LANL to run roughshod over the people and lands of New Mexico.
