Table C-3. Plant species identified in the largest pool in the Granite Canyon Reach between the granite outcrops. Observations were made by volunteer Jim McGrath on September, 9, 10, and 29, 2021. GPS coordinates for the pool are 35.17947, -108.22618 (WGS84), elevation 7,883 ft. He noted the following: The unidentified *Carex* in the Pool between the Rocks is a major rhizomatous dominant in standing water on the down canyon side of the pool. The sedge might not even be a *Carex* as I was unable to find any evidence of flowering structures.

- The forest surrounding the pool is dominated by ponderosa pine and Rocky Mountain juniper.
- The pool is about 40% of the site. Northern water plantain is found in several places in the pool or in standing water. American sloughgrass and red-sheath bulrush form a small patch in standing water on the upcanyon side of the pool. American mannagrass also forms a patch in standing water. The bank on the west side upslope from the pool contains Wooton's marsh aster, fowl bluegrass and wild mint.
- The unidentified *Carex* forms a very large patch in standing water on the downstream side of the pool. The smartweed surrounds the *Carex* on the north and west side, also in standing water. On the east side of the *Carex/Persicaria* community is a tall bank that drops sharply like a mini-cliff to the water. Fringed willow-herb and slender cudweed dominate the base of the "mini-cliff" bank. Baltic rush and Rocky Mountain iris dominate on top of the bank on the east side. Wood's rose dominates the bank above the *Carex/Persicaria* community on the west side.
