Millions of Texans, especially low income and BIOPC citizens, live in unsafe areas within a half mile radius of an oil and gas site. Premature deaths from cardiovascular and lung diseases as well as birth abnormalities are prevalent.

We need comprehensive and enforced rules to mandate reduced emissions at all oil and gas sites with a state plan that protects at least as well as the federal standards. Low-producing wells are responsible for about half of the wellsite methane pollution despite producing a relatively small amount of energy resources. These wells should be closed and capped by the companies that own them.

The TCEQ must regulate and mitigate the methane production in Texas. This is essential to protecting the climate and the health of environmental justice communities, oil and gas workers, and those living on the frontline of extraction in Texas.
