Why this matters:

- Senate Bill 1397 proposes important updates to public participation, including emailing permit notices directly to residents near facilities and allowing 36 hours for public comments after TCEQ meetings.

Comment:

(Yes the public should all have notifications to those that's close to all fence line and even 30 miles radius of a facility that being polluted. We all deserve more time for public comments because 36 hours is not enough time for public comments; I suggest TCEQ give 5 to 30 days to submit final comments after public meetings.)

- It also allows TCEQ to consider industrial accidents like fires or explosions when reviewing future permits, which could result in permits being denied.

- The bill increases penalties for violations from \$25,000 to \$40,000 per day, holding industries more accountable for protecting public health and the environment.
