Suggestion: How many low chlorine level letters to DR's and AA's have to send out every month due to homeowners not adding chlorine tablets or liquid to their systems as designed? TCEQ should MANDATE that ALL initial maintenance contracts include provisions for adding chlorine to systems with low levels. This would effectively eliminate thousands of dollars in mailed notices and free up countless hours spent by DR's and AA's throughout the state. For example, part of each contract could be a refundable service fee of \$50.00 per system under contract. The MP could then waive the fee as a part of renewals for owners that maintain their systems and DR's/AA's would only be notified of significant violations discovered in the field.
