- 1. Improved display of public notices via:
- -Printed notices posted in public areas
- -Printed notice published in a local paper with the largest area circulation
- -Signs posted on the applicant's premises of adequate size to read while driving past
- -Printed notices mailed to nearby residents (for example, those within a five-mile radius)
- -Printed copies of all related application materials available in local public libraries
- -Online access to all related application materials for EVERY permit request (ie by providing QR code on printed materials)
- 2. Improved content of public notices by adding:
- -A brief description that summarizes the permit action in layman's terms (ie build new plant or expand existing plant or add pollution control devices or increase pollution)
- -A QR code leading people to application materials posted online
- 3. Improved public meetings with the following adjustments:
- -The public comment period should be extended to 36 hours after the meeting for ALL permit applications, including land, air and water.
- -Virtual meetings are welcome if they are in addition to, but do not replace, in-person public meetings.
