The area that they are proposing to develop in is home to two State Parks and a National Fish Hatchery which would be majorly impacted. We are in a drought area and the consumption that their plant would consume would exacerbate the problem. There are endangered birds in the area that would be threatened as well as other wildlife.

The TCEQ should further develop their list of BMPs, making sure to thoroughly address all of the issues that the Legislature directed them to address.
