Now these are niceties, but I have to wonder what the continued flow through the sand pit is doing to the river, future flood control, future dredging costs.. etc. When a dam breaks, it means the owner has not taken proper measures and should face penalties such as daily/weekly fines until the repair is implemented. Why is this not enforced?

- >>Pit capture (when a river starts flowing through a mine)
