The Trinity Report appears thorough in regard to monitoring air quality and environmental standards.

However, if agreed upon standards are NOT met and timely corrective actions are NOT taken, what recourse does ADEQ have? Fines? Suspension of operations until deficiencies are remediated? Other?

If no such recourses are available to ADEQ, the permit is "toothless" with regard to assuring that its conditions being upheld. As such, the air quality of Southern Arizonans is at considerable risk.

I respectfully request that the permit include provisions for substantial penalties for non-compliance. If such ability is not within the purview of ADEQ, I request that other cognizant Arizona State agencies incorporate such provisions either in the Permit or in official addenda to the Permit.
