I have been opposing the development of copper mining in the Santa Rita Mountains for the past 18 years for a multitude of reasons. With regard to the development of this mine it will only further degrade air quality in our area for Green Valley, Sahuarita and the over million inhabitants residing in the city of Tucson. Already on the west side of Green Valley we have the dust coming off the 19 miles of tailings along I 19.
