We live in [REDACTED] San Jose, the do use poison in their rat traps, the one they put in our carport when we lived on [REDACTED] not only did a slow dying rat was in our patio, all but a few little bunnies were gone too - I use to see up to 3 dozen little bunnies eating grass under the tree. After the rat traps were placed, I never did see all those bunnies again...only 3.

Now we live in a different neighborhood, one that borders the ranchers property, lined with oaks and pine trees. Every night we hear at least one owl until the rat traps are placed around our properties then, we hear no owls for months at a time...sometimes all season.

Myself, I use a electronic trap that I bought on Amazon. And, I place where the little bunnies and squirrels as well as birds can't reach it. This trap will catch about 1 rat ever other month...the last time, I caught 2 young rats in it at the same time. I found these to be the most humane and effective way to catch rats.
