Anticoagulants are toxic and non-selective. The wildlife that naturally controls rodents -- including owls and other raptors, coyotes and foxes, and more -- get killed by anticoagulants, causing MORE rodents to infest our California communities, not fewer, and causing other ecological consequences as our ecosystems get out of whack. Californians have been very vocal in not wanting anticoagulants. DPR MUST honor the law.

To be clear: NO rollback of AB 1788, AB 2552, or AB 1322 is acceptable. Instead, California must invest in ecological rodent control to protect raptors and predators, instead of poison.
