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On the California Coastside there is already evidence of people illegally using rodenticides which has resulted in numerous barn owl deaths this year. Instead of allowing these poisons into our environment we should be putting programs in place that will encourage and aid our local raptors to help with rodent populations. We should have additional programs that help people and businesses seal up their buildings to prevent rodents from entering or provide other solutions to solve their rodent problems that don't include poisoning our ecosystems.

I personally had to call animal control recently because of a sick skunk in our backyard that was exhibiting symptoms of poisoning. This could have easily been spread to another predator had it found the sick skunk before me. Everything is connected!!! Make decisions that keep us all safe.

No anticoagulant rodenticides should be allowed, except during a declared public health or environmental emergency (current law),

No rollback of AB 1788, AB 2552, or AB 1322 is acceptable, and

California must invest in ecological rodent control to protect raptors and predators, not more poison.

Anticoagulants are toxic and non-selective, killing the very wildlife that naturally controls rodents.

DPR is legally obligated to protect wildlife, not poison it.

Allowing >100 days of poison use ensures continued contamination of predators, pets, and ecosystems.

Californians have already demanded poison-free solutions, so DPR must honor the law.
