I oppose relaxation of the rules that put unintended wildlife in danger. No anticoagulant rodenticides should be allowed, except during a declared public health or environmental emergency (current law). No rollback of AB 1788, AB 2552, or AB 1322 is acceptable.

Anticoagulants are toxic and non-selective, killing the very wildlife that naturally controls rodents. It's the non-selective nature that I oppose, either by directly ingesting it or by eating prey that has ingested it.

DPR is legally obligated to protect wildlife, not poison it.

Allowing >100 days of poison use ensures continued contamination of predators, pets, and ecosystems.

Californians have already weighed in on poison-free solutions, so I expect DPR to honor the law.
