The proposal to allow more than 100 days each year of poison use will devastate the environment. Anticoagulants are toxic and non-selective, killing the very wildlife like raptors and carnivore mammals that naturally controls rodents. As such, this proposal ensures continued contamination of predators, pets, and ecosystems. The proposal rollbacks protections, which runs counter to DPR's legal obligations to protect wildlife. No anticoagulant rodenticides should be allowed except during a declared public health or environmental emergency (current law), and no rollback of AB 1788, AB 2552, or AB 1322 is acceptable. Californians have already demanded poison-free solutions, so DPR must honor the law by investing in ecological rodent control to protect raptors and predators, not more poison.
