No anticoagulant rodenticides should be allowed, except during a declared public health or environmental emergency (as stated in the current law)

No rollback of AB 1788, AB 2552, or AB 1322 is acceptable, and California must invest in ecological rodent control to protect raptors and predators, and not poison.

It would be detrimental to our wildlife to allow again anticoagulant rodenticides as they are toxic and non selective, killing the very wildlife that naturally controls rodents. DPR is legally obligated to protect wildlife, not poison it. Allowing >100 days of poison use ensures continued contamination of predators, pets, and ecosystems.

Californians have already demanded poison-free solutions, so DPR must honor the law
