DPR's proposal undermines AB1788, AB2552 and AB1322 by reopening pathways for routine, widespread poison use, without emergency justification. No anticoagulant rodenticides should be allowed, except during a declared public health or environmental emergency (current law). No rollback of AB 1788, AB 2552, or AB 1322 is acceptable. California must invest in ecological rodent control to protect raptors and predators, not more poison. Rodenticides kill not only rats, but also wildlife, including coyotes, foxes, owls and hawks and many other raptors and carnivores that naturally control rodent populations.
