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As Dr. Bradman mentioned, it is concerning that DPR reviews pesticides one-by-one. DPR should review chemicals by class.

Evaluations should consider mixtures and synergies, as Dr. Kegley mentioned.

We don't need DPR or SPARC to spend more time identifying priority pesticides when OEHHHA has already adopted a strong list of 124 pesticides of special concern. This list should include all organophosphates and other cholinesterase inhibitors should be included.

We don't want further delays by endless reviews. DPR must use a precautionary approach and truly follow an environmental justice approach and act now to reduce and phase out the most hazardous pesticide classes.

The industry should adapt to the social and environmental needs of our state.
