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Stop amendments to CARB and reduce the body's authority to measurement only. There are two reasons:

1. "Greenhouse gas" emissions have not been scientifically proven to produce "climate change" or "global warming". There are no studies with unanimous scientific accreditation that prove an increase in global temperature resulting solely from greenhouse gas emissions. Studies such as the "Karl Study" have been called into question for faulty and misleading data with minimal oversight prior to publication. Political Scientist Bjorn Lomborg has averred that government-driven initiatives like the Paris Accord in the major and CARB in the minor cost taxpayers trillions with no beneficial effect for the environment or for the people who live in it.

2. Any effort to control or reduce greenhouse gas emissions further by the state of California is irrelevant compared to greenhouse gas emissions by the rest of the world. According to the EPA, the US contributes 13% to all global greenhouse gas emissions and 2023 EIA data estimates California to produce 6% of all US emissions. This represents a total of 0.8% of global greenhouse gas emissions for the state of California and less than 3% of the greenhouse gas emissions of China alone. Add to this that greenhouse gas emission estimates are only accurate to 5% per ESSD, California could stop all greenhouse gas emissions today and have 0 impact on global greenhouse gas emissions. California has restricted greenhouse gas emissions beyond the point of diminishing returns.

California by the numbers cannot lead any reduction in global greenhouse gas emissions, and in fact can increase emissions by a factor of two and still have no measurable impact on global greenhouse gas emissions just due to measurement error. Therefore, ANY additional costs borne by the taxpayers of California toward greenhouse gas regulation is wasted taxpayer money.

CARB can instead eliminate all self reporting, oversight and regulation (read sub-agencies and related costs) in favor of leading the way in objective measurement. Improving measurement accuracy of 5-10% in greenhouse gas emissions by objective means can be a world-leading goal worthy of California.
